STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- Student cameras MUST be on and the student's face clearly visible during all instructional time.
 - If a student cannot be seen on camera, the teacher will move the student to the waiting room. After several minutes, the student will be readmitted to class.
 - If the student still cannot be seen on camera, the student will be removed from class and marked absent.
 - Repeated issues will require a meeting with the principal or assistant principal.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to attend classes every day that school is in session during the scheduled time.
 A student will be marked tardy if he/she is not in the waiting room by the published start time.
- Absences are marked in MiStar
- Tardies are marked in MiStar 2 tardies = 1 absence for truancy purposes
 Truancy will be filed at 7 absences.

- 2. ALL summative assessments, including final exam, must be completed with a score of at least a 3 which is equivalent to a B (83%) or better.

Biology

This year-long, freshmen level, activity-based course investigates the essential and core content expectations for biology. Topics include organization and development of living systems, interdependence of living systems and the environment, genetics, evolution, and biodiversity.

Honors designation can be earned in biology by successful completion and submission of a relevant Capstone project.

Physics

Physics engages students with analogies from real-world situations to build a strong conceptual understanding of physical principles. With this foundation, students can understand equations and formulas and make connections between physics concepts and everyday phenomena. This course is inquiry-based, and students will work in small groups to draw conclusions about the natural world.

Chemistry

Chemistry is a course based on laboratory investigations of matter, chemical reactions, and the role of energy in those reactions. Students will be participating in experimentation, discussion, and exploration as well as argumentation of evidence to come to scientific conclusions.

Honors designation can be earned in chemistry by successful completion of challenge questions on each test and earning an 80% or greater on the final exam.

-Physical Education will consist of the students exploring different ways to stay active while at home. -Classes will consist of bellwork and following along to stretching and yoga videos, followed by a student led warm up and then either skill work or fitness.

-Skill work: Students will be given time to practice certain skills related to sports such as soccer, basketball, volleyball, etc. -Students will also learn basic rules and strategies used in common sports.


