


EXTENDED CORE CLASSES




EXPECTATIONS

- + Be on time
- + Be engaged
- + Be honest and kind

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- + Student cameras MUST be on and the student's face clearly visible during all instructional time.
 - + If a student cannot be seen on camera, the teacher will move the student to the waiting room. After several minutes, the student will be readmitted to class.
 - + If the student still cannot be seen on camera, the student will be removed from class and marked absent.
 - + Repeated issues will require a meeting with the principal or assistant principal.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND ENGAGEMENT ARE CRITICAL TO SUCCESS.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- + Students are expected to attend classes every day that school is in session during the scheduled time.
- + A student will be marked tardy if he/she is not in the waiting room by the published start time.
- + Absences are marked in MiStar
- + Tardies are marked in MiStar 2 tardies = 1 absence for truancy purposes
- Truancy will be filed at 7 absences.

EACH STUDENT IS EXPECTED TO ...

- + Participate in learning and review assignments.
- + Adhere to the DPS Code of Conduct.
- + Advocate for him/herself with teachers.
- + Respond to email communications from his/her teachers via the district email or Schoology.
- + Be respectful to him/herself, classmates and staff.
- + Be honest and complete his/her own work, cite sources and not plagiarize or google during tests.

ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

- + Students are required to take all Federal and State Mandated assessments in-person. (WIDA, MStep, PSAT)
- + K-8 students will take NWEA twice a year in-person.
- + Any student caught cheating on unit assessments will have to come in person for those.

All testing dates and times will be determined by Dearborn Public Schools staff.

PARENT SUPPORT IS ESSENTIAL.

Provide a place for your child to learn.

- + At a table or desk
- + Distraction free
- Take away all electronics except the chromebook or laptop
- + Have supplies organized, available and ready.

Monitor your child

- Be sure his/her camera is on so he/she is visible on screen
- + Review their work
- + Email teachers when you have concerns or need assistance

PARENT COMMUNICATION

- + additional support is needed.

- + Your child needs social emotional support
- + If there are any hardships or family issues requiring additional support and/or care.

Parents MUST have a current email in MiStar.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

Please contact your child's principal if you have concerns that have not been resolved.

Please do not interrupt instruction by joining the remote class.

Parents MUST have a current email in MiStar.

REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

The child's parent or guardian MUST report the absence.

Absences may be reported by calling 827–8405.

Absences may also be reported in MiStar.

Attendance calls will be made.

Truancy will be filed for excessive absences.
